6. Local Trust Representative (Rep) Jeanette Harold

- Make It Happen With Big Local information brochures were handed out to decisionmakers in attendance containing useful resources, JH drew attention to the 10 days funded LT national offers.
- North East and Cumbria Big Local Learning Cluster Saturday 16th July 2022 10.30 to 3.00. At Woodhouse Close Church Community Centre, Proudfoot Drive, Bishop Auckland, DL14 6PD Theme: Working with young people. A discussion developed around the ongoing decline in the statutory provision of youth services and the dependency on funded youth workers/ detached youth workers supported by families and volunteers.
- 7. Barbara Slasor and Susan Graydon: (BS not in attendance) SG gave a verbal update. BS had taken 2 weeks of annual leave in this period and SG had taken 1 week's annual leave.
 - Bridge Creative Dorset Place both GGBL staff were excited to accompany Ben and some of the individuals who will be accessing the building to look at the progress to date, Trades4Care are currently bringing the building to life alongside the builders who are finishing the final fixes before the team can begin moving into their own space.
 - Community Practioner's Network Peer Learning Circle (PLC) accredited course SG has finished her 6 months fully funded (LT) accredited coursed, this has been a valued resource to tap into and the transferable skills will benefit both personally and professionally.
 - Bishop Auckland Bowling Club Volunteer Brokerage scheme support is ongoing with a new volunteer introduced and policies and procedures updated.

• Bishop Auckland "Green Fair Day" planning meetings, SG is attending in her capacity as Partnership Support Assistant. The event date is Saturday 10th September 2022 at Cockton Hill Methodist Church, from 10 am to 4 pm. This event aims to bring people in the communities together around the themes of living sustainably and caring for the earth, emphasing that this is also connected with caring for ourselves and each other.
GJ has been actively engaging with Cockton Hill Junior and infant school, encouraging the children to support a fun, interactive project that will be one of the many items on the agenda. The capacity for youth engagement could be grown as this event as it is envisioned to become an annual occurrence, allowing for replication across more of our schools in the GGBL partnership. Wear Rivers Trust and West Auck St Helen's Railway group have agreed to support in partnership, SG introduced previously members from both who have the same objects, they have joined together on litter picking activities in St Helen Auckland and West Auckland and are keen to team up the established group which runs from the Baptist Church
